Liaising between the community and the humaniki engineering team, in multiple rounds of development, you troubleshoot and make decisions to ensure the tool is effective. Finally, you'll communicate the project's development through blog posts, online trainings and other media.

Responsibilities

- Identify and contact partners with whom to co-design humaniki
- Conduct interviews or focus groups with partners, synthesizing those experiences into prioritized feature recommendations
- Run user tests and reviews with partners as part of iterative software development
- Hold online trainings for the tool once it is launched
- Write blog posts and documentation for the project
